lusts on a rampage of sharp knives and easy girls!" "She writhed on the bed...but with Rose you didn't worry about fine points. You just went ahead and had fun, because she enjoyed anything." Minimum bid: \$5.

A6 - [N] - *Sin Cruise*, "an original Nightstand Book," 192 pages. "Fifteen days at sea—fifteen nights of love!" "Makeout at sea…in sinful waters." Minimum bid: \$5.

A7 - [N] - *Summertime Affair*. "an original Nightstand Book," 192 pages, cover by McCauley. "A frank novel of infidelity. David and Janice shared lust in an illicit affair." Minimum bid: \$5.

B20 - [N] - *The Goon Goes West*, Irish fan John Berry's 180-page account of his U.S. trip undertaken in 1959 as the result of a special fund, not unlike Bring Bruce Bayside, that brought him to the 1959 Detroit Worldcon and then to Seattle . Wellillustrated with photographs, maps and numerous ATom illustrations, and Berry paints excellent verbal portraits of numerous fans. This copy, donated by Alan Rosenthal (thanks!), has a quarter-inch hole in the lower left front cover (not near any artwork), rusty staples, and a minor stain on all pages on the lower right side, but otherwise in fine condition. Minimum bid: \$10.

C4 - [N] - *Fanac* No. 34, February 24, 1959, otherwise known as *The Fannish I*, 29 pages. Edited, published and mostly written by Terry Carr and Ron Ellik, , this issue presents an excellent survey of fanzine fandom in 1958. Cover by Bjo, interior art by Bjo, ATom and Ray Nelson. There are brief articles on British, New York and L.A. fandom by Archie Mercer, Dick Ellington and Forry Ackerman, respectively, and then the results of the *Fanac* Poll on 1958 fanzine activity. Minimum bid: \$10.

C5 - [N] - *The Fannish III*, prepared by Terry Carr in 1961 but not published until 1964 by Bruce Pelz, 28 pages. Artwork by ATom, Andy Reiss,

Bhob Stewart and Steve Stiles. This issue extensively surveys 1960's fanzine fanac, with most of the writing done by Terry Carr with assistance from Bill Donaho. Min imum bid: \$8.

C6 - [N] - Terry Carr Group No. 2, consisting of: Entropy No. 1 (& only), November 1964, 25 pages, with cover by ATom, bacover by Mervyn Barrett, and interior art by ATom, Bjo, Lee Hoffman and Steve Stiles. This was a precursor to the "Entropy Reprints" columns that Terry did for numerous fanzines over the next several decades. In his editorial Terry surveys reprint fanzines, and then presents contributions by Bob Tucker, Sam Youd, Dave English, Walt Liebscher (his hilarious song, "I Want to Pass Away in Pasadena"), Dean Grennell, Jack Darrow and Mal Ashworth, selected from fanzines ranging from 1937 to 1957. Also, three issues of Gilgamesh, Terry's perzine done for Lilapa with some limited outside distribution: No. 53, June 15, 1978, 10 pages, with Terry writing on fan gossip, fan letters received on his anthologies, and the comic books he did as a kid (with examples). No. 65, August 1983, 12 pages, in which Terry admits he's no longer a publishing jiant, writes on *literature* and SF, and reports on the 1983 Westercon. No. 69, July 1985, 8 pages (and the final issue), entirely devoted to Terry's account of the 1985 Westercon. Minimum bid: \$7.
